**Did you ever work at a Department of Energy/Atomic Energy Commission site? If yes, this letter is for you.**

The Building Trades National Medical Screening Program (BTMed) provides *FREE* medical screening services to construction workers who worked at DOE/AEC sites. More than 20,500 former workers have participated. You too, may be eligible to participate.

BTMed provides many benefits for construction workers, such as:

1. A free work history interview and a free medical screening exam.
2. If you have health concerns, you can have them checked out and may detect a disease early.
3. Participants can be re-screened every three years.
4. You may be eligible for compensation under the Energy Employees Occupational Illness Compensation Program Act (EEOICPA). EEOICPA provides compensation to workers or their survivors for illnesses caused by exposure to radiation or other toxic hazards during employment in the nuclear weapons industry. By taking part in BTMed, you may find out if you have a compensable illness.
